

Amended Resolution 15-09: Disaster Relief Assistance - ACTION

Summary

In 2015, two of the Golden State Finance Authority's member counties, Calaveras and Lake, suffered devastating wildfires which resulted in a large number of residences being destroyed. As a result of the Butte Fire (Calaveras) and the Valley Fire (Lake), nearly 2,000 homes were deemed destroyed. Both the Butte and Valley fire are state and federally declared disasters.

Issue

On December 9, 2015, the GSFA Board of Directors adopted Resolution 15-09 allocating \$1.5 million in disaster funding to provide assistance to these member counties and residents. \$500,000 (\$350,000 to Lake and \$150,000 to Calaveras) was provided directly to the counties for assistance with the costs of providing temporary housing and/or shelter to individuals and families that have been displaced due to the loss of their residence from the fires.

The remaining \$1 million of appropriated funds was initially intended to be provided by GSFA directly to individuals and families, through a program to be established by GSFA, to assist in rebuilding or to obtain a future long-term residence. The proposed guidelines of the program included household income not to exceed 115% of the Area Median Income and the maximum assistance to an individual household limited to \$2,500. Staff is proposing revising the program with the following amendments:

- The remaining \$1 million of appropriated funds be provided directly to Lake County (\$700,000) and Calaveras County (\$300,000) to provide to individuals and families, following the general guidelines developed by GSFA;
- Fees charged to administer the program by county or a third-party administrator be permitted, but not to exceed 5% of allocated funds under this portion of the program; and
- The household income limit be revised to 115% of State Median Income (\$80,500).

Both a clean and track change version of the amended Resolution are attached.

Recommendation

It is recommended that the GSFA Board of Directors adopt Amended Resolution 15-09: Disaster Relief Assistance.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> GSFA hereby allocates a total amount of One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000) of unrestricted funds to be used for an Emergency Disaster Assistance Program (the "Program") to assist residents living within a member County who meet the following criteria:

- The residence is in an area declared to be a state or federal disaster area in 2015;
- Damaged property caused by the disaster must have been the primary residence (owned or rented) of the applicant;
- The property must have been designated by CALFIRE as destroyed (more than 50% damaged);
- The assistance is to benefit the individuals/families that have been displaced;
- To provide timely assistance to immediate temporary housing and shelter needs a portion of the funds may be allocated to assist with this need.

<u>Section 2</u>. The Board further resolves that \$500,000 of the appropriated Program funds shall be provided directly to the appropriate county agency or department of Lake and Calaveras Counties for direct assistance to be used for the costs of providing temporary housing and/or shelter to individuals and families displaced due to loss of residence from the fire, in the manner

that such counties deem appropriate. The allocation shall be in the following amounts based on the CALFIRE reports of residences destroyed:

Lake County \$350,000 Calaveras County \$150,000

<u>Section 3.</u> The remaining \$1 million of appropriated Program funds shall be provided directly to the appropriate county agency or department of Lake and Calaveras Counties to be used for individual/family assistance portion and shall generally follow the guidelines (the "Guidelines") developed by GSFA in consultation with legal counsel as outlined below. Fees charged to administer the Program by County or a third-party administrator may not exceed 5% of allocated funds under this portion of the Program.

The allocation shall be in the following amounts based on the CALFIRE reports of residences destroyed:

Lake County \$700,000 Calaveras County \$300,000

The Guidelines:

- The funds shall be provided directly by County or third-party administrator to individuals and families in an effort to assist rebuilding or to obtain a future long-term residence,
- Household income of the applicant may not exceed \$80,500 (115% State Median Income), which may be certified by signed affidavit from displaced individual/family,
- Assistance to an individual household will be limited to a maximum amount of \$2,500.

Summary

At the January 20, 2016 GSFA Board meeting, the Board approved Resolution 16-01 fulfilling the Board's responsibilities of governance required in the Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement by documenting the process by which the Authority accepts associate members. Among other related items, the Resolution approved acceptance of the new Associate Members joining GSFA during 2016.

At the meeting, it was stated that updates will be provided at future GSFA Board of Directors meetings on the status of membership and associate membership as appropriate. Through August 29, 2016, GSFA has added eight additional associate member cities.
